

## Appendix 3 – Fauna of the Conservation Area

To date no formal fauna surveys have been conducted in the conservation area, however incidental observations have recorded a number of significant species. The table below indicates those significant species that have been recorded on the property or are considered likely to utilise habitats within the conservation area. Incidental fauna records have been noted by the owner & during site visits.
